PedsCases ([www.pedscases.com](http://www.pedscases.com)) is a free open-access medical education resource for pediatric learners. Our model is student-driven, with students creating educational content for other students. We offer a wide variety of learning resources including podcasts, interactive cases, clinical videos, reference documents, and links to important pediatric resources. Content is created by medical students and residents under the supervision of a faculty member, to ensure high quality content. Resources are aligned with the Canadian Undergraduate Curriculum in Paediatrics (canuc-paeds). PedsCases has had considerable growth in the last few years, with an increase in content production, exposure and collaborations with other medical education organizations.
